#### AIS Students - Term 2 - Your time to shine

Some advice to all our students. This is the term where you really 'drill down' and implement those goal achievement strategies that you focused on in your Wellbeing classes in Term 1. Our English for Academic Purposes for SACE Connect students have 10 more weeks to really strengthen their English language proficiency as they prepare to transition to their destination school here in Adelaide. If their English language proficiency is not where it needs to be – they may need to push back their entry into their preferred destination school. Stay strong. Stay focused. Good luck.

Our Year 11 (Stage 1) students are finishing off assessments for Semester 1 subjects and are preparing for upcoming end of semester examinations. Their teachers will help them learning Examination Preparation Techniques to be ready for this assessment opportunity. All our AIS students are given 3 trial examination opportunities to be well prepared for their graduating examinations in November of their Year 12. Ms Zara Phillips – will publish further information and advice to parents and students regarding examinations coming up in June. Parents – please encourage your students to take up these strategies so they are well prepared to do well in these examinations. Taking examinations is not something we are born with (as I often hear in the media). Examination taking is a skill. Like all skills – you can learn it and you can improve it with rigorous opportunities to refine this skill. I often say – good luck as a family and school community. The more we work together teaching our children these strategies – the better the outcome and confidence in each child.

Our Year 12 (Stage 2) students. You are nearly halfway through your graduating school year. Soldier on. Stay strong. This is also when some of the toughest topics are studied in your classes. Remember to ask your teachers for help and assistance in class. Don't sit there quietly trying to deal with difficult concepts on your own. Students who ask questions — perform so much better in examinations and tests — because by asking questions their brain is mind-mapping these challenging concepts. Be an active learner. Don't be a passive participant learner. No pain — no gain. I strongly believe in this saying! Remember it's not long this painful time. You will get a brilliant reward for all your hard work now — you will achieve your future goals for university study and career plans — this brilliant reward is the longest school holiday break ever — 3 months holidays before university starts. I wish to share this heartfelt message from Don Chen, our Managing Director/Board of Governors member: "I am sad to announce that our beloved ex AIS, ISES and AEG member, Wendy Weng has passed away a short time ago (Tuesday 3 May) in the Queen Elizabeth hospital. Those of us who knew her are going to miss her beautiful smile and her kind heart towards her colleagues and students.

Wendy has been fighting for her life since the beginning of last year when she was diagnosed with cancer. Wendy has been living with her daughter, Isabel since 2017, when she lost her husband, Andy, who also died of cancer.

Andy and Wendy both were working with our partner school in Hangzhou, Greentown School when I first met them. When Isabel approached school age, they decided to come back to Australia. I invited them to come to work with Adelaide International School. Unfortunately, Andy couldn't make it in time. Wendy then decided to bring Isabel with her to come down to Adelaide.
