Mid-Term 2 News

Welcome to mid-term!

This week is week 5 and we are half-way through the teaching and learning for the term. The last few weeks are typically busy, and a focus on student time management is necessary. In the coming weeks, students in the different programs have a range of activities to prepare for.

English for Academic Purposes

Students in the EAP program have summative assessment tasks which are "levelled". From this process we can see the growth in language level. Our data shows that students often grow one language and literacy level per term. Of course, this does vary depending on if the student is working online or onsite, is living in the community and speaking English most of the time, and on the commitment and abilities of the student. Sometimes students will show growth of more than one level, and sometimes they plateau. Year 11 (Stage 1)

Our Year 11 students are currently preparing for their mid-year examinations. This is the first time the Year 11 students will experience a SACE style exam. The following students taking these subjects at AIS will undertake Year 11 examinations:

- Stage 1 SACE English as an Additional Language (EAL)
- Stage 1 SACE Mathematics for Specialist Maths

Stage 1 SACE Mathematics – for Mathematical Methods

All Year 11 examinations at Adelaide International School are 1 ½ hours in duration.

AIS will not teach classes on FRIDAY of Week 5 – THIS FRIDAY 3^{rd} June. This is a study day. Students do not need to come to school on this day. On Friday, students do need to study hard for their 3 examinations.

Students must have their notes sheets ready for their Mathematics exams – as explained by their subject teachers. Teachers will check note sheets prior to commencement of examinations. Please ensure all guidelines explained are followed carefully. Check with your mathematics teacher as needed before your study day.

Students are not allowed to have note sheets for the EAL examination. Students can use a dictionary in the EAL exam.

Year 12 (Stage 2)

Students have Trial examinations in Week 1 of Term 3. This is the week beginning Monday 25th of July. Students are encouraged to take one week off for school holidays and use the second week of the winter break to study hard and be prepared for their Mid-Year Trial Examinations.

Year 12 Trial examinations begin on Tuesday with Specialist Mathematics and Essential Mathematics.

Year 12 examinations will only assess the topics and work taught during Semester One. Full coursework trial examinations of the full years' work will occur later in the year, when all courses have been taught.
