Wellbeing Hub

In Wellbeing, we continue to target key initiatives that support each student to achieve their goals.

Year 11 students have been debriefing on their first SACE formative examination experience – reflecting on various examination techniques they implemented in June end of Semester One examinations and how effective these strategies were for them. This will assist our Year 11s to be ready for Semester 2 SACE formative examinations – preparing them for the summative examinations at the end of Year 12 in November 2023.

Our Year 12 students have two opportunities for formative SACE examinations this year – in the week beginning 25 July 2022, where they have mid-year trial examinations, and in September 2022, when they have a second formative examination opportunity based on the full year's work. Students have worked through key strategies to support them in this preparation. We wish them well as they implement these in their upcoming learning opportunity.

Our Middle Years and SACE Connect EAP students do not have examinations. They do have a key focus on developing their personal communication skills, their team skills, their general capabilities, and having a better understanding of the Australian culture and sharing cultural experiences from their home country.

On Thursday 16 June, we were pleased to have four guests from HerTechPath at AIS; Ms Eva Balan-Vnuk, Ms Diana Raileanu, Ms Laura Mercurio and Ms Sonya Weiser. They delivered a workshop on STEM careers. (STEM = SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING and MATHEMATICS).

The aim of the workshop was to encourage students, especially girls, to consider studying in STEM areas in the future. Our guests shared many inspiring personal stories and experiences of working in the STEM field with our students and promoted some great conversations about students' future careers through the IKIGAI Canvas activity and panel Q&A session. At the end of the session, we received positive feedback from many of our students, and we are sharing some of them in this week's newsletter:
